SSADL Home Produced Qualifiers are OPEN to both Members and Non-Members of SSADL No Spurs with the exception to adult side saddle riders, who are allowed a Spur Band, Dummy or Blunt Spur. No Galloping or canter extensions, For Rider/Handler No Wearing of Face/Body Jewellery with the exception to the earring used by competitors with health problems. Foals are NOT permitted SSADL Classes. For In-Hand Classes- Minimum age of handler = 11 years old. First Ridden ponies/riders will be asked after the initial walk round to come into the centre of the ring. First Ridden Competitors will only canter in their individual shows. Lead Rein Riders/First Ridden competitors: If a strip section is required a lead rein rider **MUST** stay mounted.

STALLIONS - Either for In Hand or Ridden classes, Competitors Must be 16 years of age or over. Competitors cannot enter the ring once the command of trot has been given. The same rider/handler/pony/horse combination must stay the same from qualifier to Grand Finals, unless special circumstances should arise, then it will be left to the discretion of the Directors and Advisory Committee to oversee this rule if required.

2026 Qualification System: SSADL Members will receive their own qualification card. This is to be signed in the at time of judging/presentation. This is the members' responsibility to ensure the right qualifier is signed for.

1. 1st to 6th in each age group will qualify for the SSADL London International Horse Show 2nd round qualifiers 2026.
2. 1st to 6th from each AGE section will qualify for the SSADL Members Open Challenge. (Lead Rein Ponies are NOT permitted) Open to all types and Breeds. Members Mountain and Moorland Challenge. (Lead Rein Ponies are NOT permitted) Members Foreign Breeds Challenge.
3. The 6 highest placed Lead/or First Ridden Members Lead Rein/First Ridden Challenge
4. 1st – 3rd in each age group will qualify for the Senior of Year Championship

(If a competitor has already qualified the qualification can be passed down the line).

Once a member has filled out their qualification card to the relevant classes then said card must be sent into the Office by normal post no later than the 30th August 2026. REMEMBER TO PHOTOCOPY YOUR CARD.

Non – Members Qualification cards will be handed out in the ring to the six highest placed competitors in each section these are for Non-Members ONLY

Qualification cards MUST be returned to SSADL Head Office within the 10-day period of date of show along with a 2026 Membership application completed and payment made. Once a qualification card/membership is sent in correctly along with payment only then will Members be eligible for the Members Challenge Preliminary rounds and Challenge Finals to be held at the SSADL National Championship Show on the 20th & 21st September 2026 at Onley Grounds, Rugby, Warwickshire.

Class 20. Tattersalls RoR NOVICE Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026

Tattersalls RoR NOVICE Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height, must have raced in GB and have current RoR Competition Membership. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026. **Horses will be ridden by the Judge** and will be stripped for conformation assessment. Horses to be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

All those entering and/or participating in RoR classes agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Competitors/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

Racing injuries and blemishes are NOT ignored in this series

The first three go forward to the Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships Aintree, August 22nd, 2026.

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st –4th plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £30, 2nd £20, 3rd £10

To take part in this class, horses must NOT have won: a ridden open class under any affiliated showing society including (inc SEIB/HOYS, BSHA, SHB(GB) BSPS, BSPA, Tattersalls RoR Open /Amateur Ridden Show Series Qualifier, TARRA Ridden, or any other open class **except** Tattersalls RoR Challenge Show Series, other Working Hunter type classes or RoR In Hand classes. Unaffiliated Show wins are not considered.

Horses may remain in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Ridden Show Series (Formerly RoR Jockey Club Novice Show Series) classes until they have won three Tattersalls RoR Novice Show Series Qualifiers. They are de-noviced on their third novice win or at midnight on the day they win an open class, whichever happens first. They are still eligible to compete in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships.

Class 21. Tattersall RoR Open Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026

Open to RoR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over by January 1st 2026. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

The first THREE go forward to the championship at Hickstead on June 21st 2026.

All entries **MUST** be competition registered with the RoR and include their competition registration number on entry form and have **RACED in GB**. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) or will provide 2 ride judges should the entries exceed 20. Please mark your entry form accordingly. **Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series**

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st–4th plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £30, 2nd £20, 3rd £10, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

*For qualifiers held after July 31st, 2025, **the winner qualifies** for the Tattersalls RoR Open Ridden Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd, 2026. The Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same day.*

The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes or the Finals.

Class 22. Rising Star Ridden Hack / Riding Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms. The two highest placed unqualified will qualify for the Associate Rising Star Series Hack/Riding Horse Final at the BSHA National Championships Show September 2026.

Class 23. Rising Star Ridden Show Cob: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms. Exhibits to be shown hogged. The two highest placed unqualified will qualify for the Associate Rising Star Series Cob Final at the BSHA National Championships Show September 2026.

Class 24. Rising Star Ridden Show Hunter: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms. The two highest placed unqualified will qualify for the Associate Rising Star Series Hunter Final at the BSHA National Championships Show September 2026. **Kindly sponsored by The Horse Taxi.**

Class 25. Rising Star Racehorse to Show Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm. Open to Thoroughbred & Arab horses retired from race training. The two highest placed unqualified will qualify for the Associate Rising Star Series Racehorse to Show Horse Final at the BSHA National Championships Show September 2026. This class is open to competitors who work within the racing industry.

Class 25B Associate Open Style & Performance: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm. Open to ALL types, riders aged 15 years and over. This is a flat class to be judged solely on performance; there will be no conformation marks awarded, and exhibits will not be stripped. The two highest placed unqualified will qualify for the Open Style & Performance Final at the BSHA National Championships Show September 2026.

The Associate Open Style & Performance Series class is open to exhibits shown astride or side saddle (ladies only) and will be marked, and judged as follows:

Exhibitors will ride together as a class, which will be considered as part of the collective marks.

Exhibitors will then be asked to perform a freestyle show/ display (max 2.5 mins), which will be marked, to include, (but not restricted to), in any order:

- on both reins, walk, trot and canter.
- halt in the middle of the show/display for 4 secs before proceeding.
- a canter change of rein across the diagonal through trot or walk (5 strides max).
- lengthened canter strides.
- free walk on a long rein.

Qualification cards will NOT be sent out to shows – but the card is available to download from the Equifest website. It is the responsibility of the rider to present the card to the Judge / Steward at the time of qualification.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The organisers, Hereford Horse Show nor Bromyard Equestrian Centre accept NO responsibility for any accident, loss or damage to any competitors, spectators, animals or property. It shall be a condition of entry that competitors will hold the organisers blameless and indemnify them against any loss, damage or legal proceedings.
2. All competitors take part at their OWN RISK and are expected to always exercise due care and obey all notices displayed.
3. The show recommends that all exhibitors should have adequate personal sports insurance.
4. All accidents/incidents/falls should be reported to the Secretary of the individual show.
5. Where classes are affiliated to other societies / associations their rules apply
6. Exhibitors: Exhibitors may not knowingly exhibit any Pony/Horse that has been bred, sold, leased or produced by the Judge, or his/her immediate family or his/her employer, or from which financial gain has been made in the last two years. Exhibitors may be asked to produce documentation if required. An exhibitor may not show an equine in a competition class judged by any member of his/her immediate family, may not show under a judge for whom he/she has produced an equine within two years of the current year date, and may not ride in a class judged by someone for whom he/she has ridden in a competition within two years of the current year date. Exhibitors in both Ridden and In-Hand classes should wear NO Face and or Body Jewellery
7. Equines: All Ridden Ponies MUST be 4 years old & over. All Colts / Stallions two years old and over must be in possession of a current license, (unless otherwise governed by the individual Breed Society) and adequately bitted. All Stallions should wear 'Stallion Badges' in all showing classes In-Hand Stallions / Colts may NOT be led by any Juniors who have not attained their 14th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Reins that restrict the natural movement of a pony/horse MUST not be used in the ring. Snaffle Bridles only should be used in Lead Rein, First Ridden, Novice Ridden & Novice Ridden Working Hunter Classes. 'Wilkie Bits' may not be used as Snaffles and may not be used as part of a double bridle. Mountain & Moorland ponies MUST be shown in their natural state and trimming MUST comply with the respective Pure Breed Society Stud Books. Mares with foals at foot MUST have attained their 4th birthday. All foals being shown MUST be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the show. No Foals to be Clipped, Lunged or shown Bitted. Mountain & Moorland Foals must be eligible for entry into their respective Pure Breed Society Stud Books.

8. **Equine Influenza: All equines should be vaccinated Annually against Equine Influenzas. We reserve the right to check passports of all equines attending the show at any time.**
9. Riders / Handlers: Any Pony Stallion not exceeding 138cms or Small Breed Mountain & Moorland Stallions may NOT be ridden by juniors who have NOT attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Stallions exceeding 138cms or Large Breed Mountain & Moorland Stallions may NOT be ridden by Juniors who have NOT attained their 14th birthday before 1st January. (unless otherwise governed by the individual Breed Society) Junior Handlers of equines in all In-Hand classes, aged 14 years and under should wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats. All Children MUST have attained their 3rd birthday by 1st January in the current year before competing in ANY ridden classes and must comply with the upper limit of the class entered and be prepared to supply a copy of their birth certificate if requested. Riders MUST be within the correct age limits for the type of Horse/Pony ridden for the qualification to be valid. In Ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony/horse and rider MUST leave the ring, rider dismounted and take no further part in the class. Correct British Standard Headgear conforming to European VG1 and/or PAS015 both with BSI Kitemarking or current standards to be worn at all times when mounted, with chinstraps from 3 points on the hat fastened. NO Spurs to worn in any ridden class and Showing Canes MUST not exceed 30".
10. Judges: The Judges' decision is final.
11. Welfare of Equines: If an equine is deemed to be being mistreated in any way whilst at the show ground, the person or persons responsible may be asked to leave the show ground and may be reported to the authorities. The show is also supporting the appropriate size/weight of rider for the equine they are riding.
12. Behaviour: Behaviour by an exhibitor or his/her servants deemed unsporting or unreasonable, may be requested to leave the showground. Any animal which in the opinion of the judge, is deemed out of control will be requested to leave the ring and/or the show ground. Any exhibitors or their servants seen using social media to air disputes will be requested to remove all their exhibits from the showground and forfeit any entry fees paid. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry of persons and or equines at the management's / secretary's discretion and without assigning a reason. All Dogs MUST be kept on leads at all times.
13. Objections: Objections must be in writing and given to the Secretary within 30 minutes of the completion of the relevant class and accompanied with a fee of £25.00 (refundable if the objection is upheld)
14. Parents of Children under eighteen years old: Parents should be aware that there may be official photographers at our show and if they do not want their children photographed, THEY MUST make their own arrangements with the photographers. Official photographers ONLY will be allowed in the rings.
15. Entry Fees: Entry Fees and associated fees are not refundable, unless Vet Certificate shown.
16. **COVID/WEATHER RESTRICTIONS:** At time of show if restrictions in place **ALL COMPETITORS MUST** adhere to all Government & Bromyard Equestrian Centre rules. In the event that show MUST be postponed all entries will be refunded minus £2.00 admin charge.
17. No Mucking out of horseboxes/trailers in car park, please use the facilities available. Take your rubbish home. No tying up of horses with haynets outside trailers/lorries.
18. Parking: As per the Bromyard Equestrian request, trailers in field facing down, lorries on the hardstanding. NO CARS to be parked next to lorries, cars in designated car area.
19. Entry Fee: The depositing of entry fee into bank account DOES NOT SECURE entry to show. All entry fees paid must be accompanied by the class no, name of horse etc. By the closing date.
20. **IMPORTANT ANYBODY SENDING EMAILS OR TEXTS AFTER THE SHOW IN ARGUMENTATIVE OR THREATENING WAY OR TAKING TO SOCIAL MEDIA IN NEGATIVE WAY WILL BE BANNED FROM ANY FUTURE HEREFORD SPRING SHOWS.**
